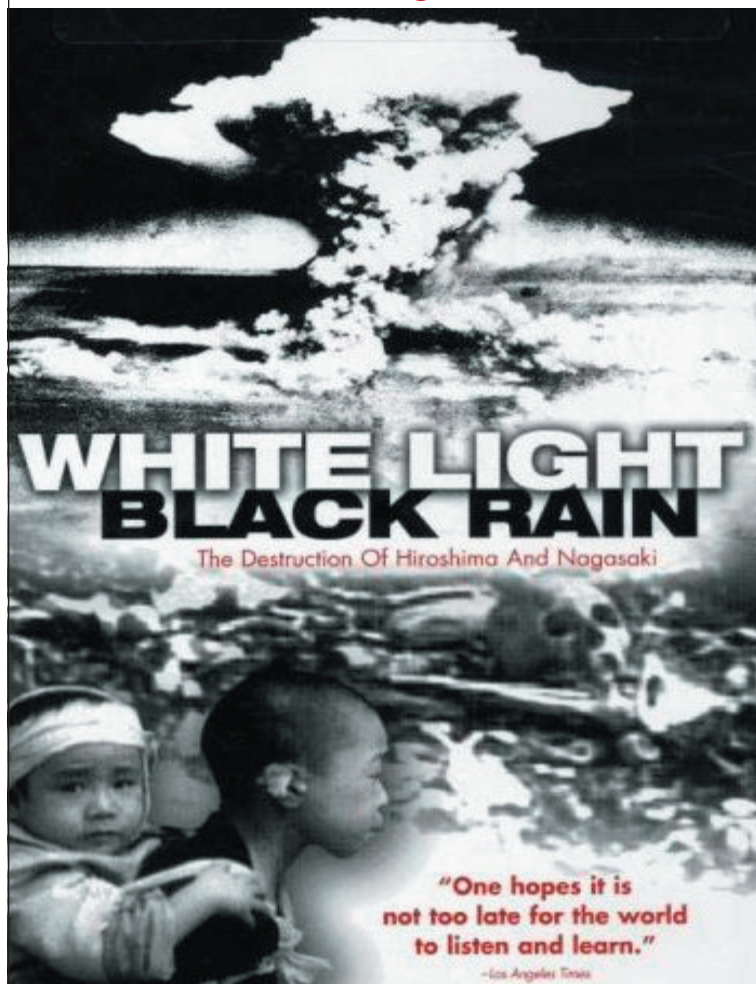

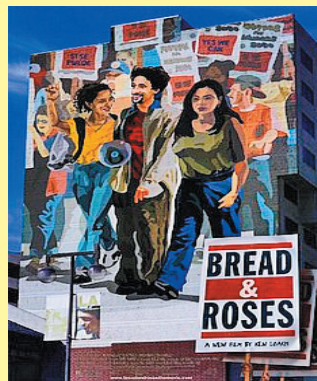


***White Light/Black Rain: The
